Me, Myself and J

A **self-portrait** is an artwork that an artist creates about himself or herself.



Albrecht Dürer. *Self-Portrait at 26*, 1498. Oil on wood.

This self-portrait was painted in 1498 by Albrecht Dürer, a German artist. He painted his first self-portrait at the age of 13, by looking at his reflection in the mirror.



Think Like an Artist

We can learn more about artists from their self-portraits. Look at what Dürer is wearing in this self-portrait. What do you think he was trying to tell us about himself?

Now, look in a mirror or at a photograph of yourself and draw your self-portrait in the space provided below. Add your drawings from page 3 to your self-portrait.




We can also tell others more about ourselves using a digital character created on the computer. This type of character is known as an **avatar**.
